



HOW TO PROTEST PROPERTY TAXES

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO PROTEST THE APPRAISAL OF YOUR PROPERTY.

THE APPEAL CAN GO THROUGH SEVERAL SOURCES:

- Your local State District Court
- Independent Arbitrator
- State Office of Administrative Hearings

You can file your appeal if your current appraisal is higher than last year's appraisal. Once you file your protest, you will receive notice for your hearing. Check with your local appraisal district to learn more about the specifics on the hearings. If you miss the filing deadline, you may still appeal under certain circumstances.

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- Your notice will be sent to you by May 1st at the latest
- File form 50-132, Notice of Protest with the Appraisal Review Board to start the process
- Have the Notice in by May 15th or thirty (30) days from the date your notice was delivered to you, whichever date is later
